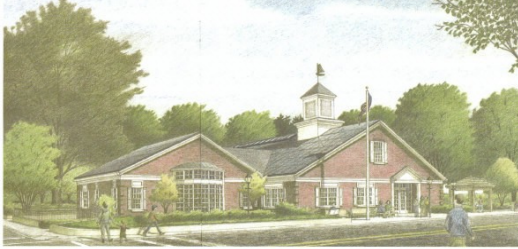

Osterville Village Library Prepares To Break Ground

Five Years Ago Today



Years ago the Trustees of the Osterville Village Library engaged the service of an architect and began to draft plans for the new building. Sadly, the chosen architect, Charles T. ("Ted") Bellingrath, passed away in November 2005, at which time the concept phase of the building design process (picture above) had been completed.

Some months were spent carefully considering the choice of a successor architect. Ultimately, the library was fortunate to obtain the service of Jeremiah Ford, III, founder and principal of Ford3 Architects. Jerry has undertaken the design development phase of the library building project (pictured below) with great care, insight and enthusiasm.



Changes are part of the normal evolution of building design when following a schematic design. The process moves into design development and construction documentation. Jerry Ford picked up exactly where Ted's work left off, designing and delivering a building in the same spirit and style that will be both elegant and functional.
